PASTOR'S JOURNAL

Life in this city is demanding with rarely a quiet moment for reflection. There seems to always be more work to be done, more bills to be paid, another exciting event to attend or friends to catch up with. From time to time it's important to pause, take stock of our life and assess whether our daily round of activities is moving us closer to the person we want to be and the life we feel called by God to live. Too much self-reflection can also be paralyzing. Some of us probably need to stop thinking, or waiting for the perfect alignment of circumstances, and just do something. A healthy life is one living in a back and forth motion of action and reflection.

Today our text presents us with a question which is as relevant today as it was when Jesus asked it to his first disciples: "What are you looking for?" This is one of those questions that can make you say, "Oh, that's easy, I'm looking for... ummm... Well, let's see... what am I looking for?" This question always reminds me of that old U2 lyric, "I still haven't found

How Great is Our God

READING THE PROPHETS **ISAIAH 49:1–7**

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away!

The LORD called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me. He made my mouth like a sharp sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away. And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." But I said, "I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the LORD, and my reward with my God." And now the LORD says, who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, and that Israel might be gathered to him, for I am honored in the sight of the LORD, and my God has become my strength— he says, "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth."

SERMON NOTES

READING THE GOSPELS JOHN 1:29–42

The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, “Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, ‘After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.’ I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.” And John testified, “I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, ‘He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.’ And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.” The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, “Look, here is the Lamb of God!”

The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” (which translated means Teacher), “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come and see.” They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas” (which is translated Peter).

This is the Word of the Lord.

what I'm looking for." Bono speaks for many of us—maybe most of us—giving voice to a deep longing for meaning and fulfillment. We haven't exactly found what we're looking for.

There's a good chance that this search is what brings you here this morning. Not to a church service so much as to a community of other seekers. My guess is that most of us don't seek out a church because we have theological questions that need answering (thought those questions no doubt exist and are important). What calls to our hearts more than anything else is the possibility of finding our way to a life well-lived—a life in which we are fulfilling some larger purpose in the world—and to do that in the company of others.

If that's your desire then I hope you'll stick around here and join us in pursuing God's way in this city.
